Abstract

Title: Importance of, "Stobhas" in Chanting of Samaveda.

As per dictum, 'Reyadhudham sama giyate' enshrined in the chhandogyopanisad(1.6.1), sama was chanted on the base of rc. The word saman neither exclusively denotes a rc nor its chanting, instead it stands for the musical chanting embodied in the rcs. In course of chanting the rc has to undergo many changes and modifications called vikaras. In addition to changing and modifications in rc verses some additional material too has to be incorporated which has nothing to do with verse. These additional materials in the form of syllable, word or sentence were added with a view to make the sama-chanting accomplished. This extra material is technically known as stobhas. The nature and the specific number of stobhas have been dealt in technical literature belonging to samaveda. Akshartantra and stobhanusamhar are the two main text dealing with stobhas. It may be mentioned that these stobhas have philosophical significance also.

In this paper an attempt has been made to discuss both technical and philosophical importance of *stobhas* in chanting of *samaveda* with practical illustrations.
