New Evidence for the Dating and Religious Practices of Pāśupatas

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There are very few instances of mentioning of the Pāśupatas in early datable materials, inscriptions or texts. So I want to draw attention to two passing references to Pāśupata ascetics: one in Vasubandhu's Abhidharmakośabhāṣya and another in Bharata's Nāṭyaśāstra. Since both these texts are of relatively early date, any information from them is important.

In the same text, Vasubandhu also criticises a position which holds \bar{I} svara to be the cause $(k\bar{a}rana)$ of everything. He concludes his criticism of these \bar{I} svarak \bar{a} ranav \bar{a} dins quoting ironically a verse of theirs about Rudra. This verse is fortunately found now incorporated in the $Mah\bar{a}bh\bar{a}rata$ in two places, in a group of few verses which explains \bar{S} iva's certain epithets and this way describe him. I will also have some remarks on those $Mah\bar{a}bh\bar{a}rata$ verses.

Moreover, with the discovery of the $P\bar{a}$ supatavidhis of Gargya, the understanding of Religious Practices of Pasupatas is widened. I will discuss ritualistic contents of these texts, and briefly state the problems involved in interpretation of these texts.
